- ✓ Must be a graduate student
- ✓ Must major in pre-school education
- ✓ Preference given to KS graduates, however, non-KS graduates will be considered

5. Amona and Suzel Ho STEM Leaders Scholarship

1 Award

- √ Two- or four-year undergraduate or graduate degree in STEM (science, technology, engineering, math)
- Submit two letters of recommendation; one from a teacher or counselor and one from an employer or community organization who can comment on your overall character, achievement, and contribution to serve the greater community

6. Ashley Meleana Joy Scholarship

(GRADUATE STUDENTS ONLY)

- ✓ Must be a graduate student
- ✓ Pursuing degree in medical field
- ✓ Classified student in medical field



7. Barry J. and Winona E. Rubin Memorial Scholarship

(NEW)

1 Award

- ✓ Must be enrolled full or half-time in a U.S. accredited post-high school institution, including vocational, trade or technical schools recognized by KS
- ✓ Demonstrate financial need by submitting the FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- ✓ Preference given to students majoring in government, political science, law, or human services
- Submit an essay response: "Describe your disadvantaged background, and despite those disadvantages, your potential for success."

8. Bartels 'Ohana Scholarship

(NEW)

This endowed scholarship was created by the family of Wilhelm F. Bartels (KS '51) 'ohana to honor and pay forward Ke Ali'i Pauahi's gift. The Bartels 'ohana has four generations of beneficiaries of Ke Ali'i Pauahi. Their wish is to pass along this gift to future generations so they can become industrious men and women to better serve the lāhui.

- ✓ Must be a third or fourth year college undergraduate or graduate student
- ✓ Must enroll full-time as a classified student in a U.S. accredited post-high school institution recognized by KS
- ✓ Minimum 3.5 GPA
- ✓ Priority will be given to students who reside on the U.S. Continent, while second preference will be given to graduates of Kamehameha Schools
- ❖ Must provide an essay that demonstrates applicant's strong desire to use their degree to give back to the lāhui, leadership qualities, and commitment to the community
- Must provide at least one letter of recommendation highlighting community service experience

9. Benedict Kalamakū Lee Loy, KS 1905 Endowed Scholarship

1 Award

- ✓ Recipients may be graduates of any high school
- ✓ Recipients must be enrolled at least half-time in any accredited post-high program, including trade schools, community colleges, 2-year colleges and 4-year universities
- ✓ Recipients shall have a GPA of 3.0-2.0, but no lower than 2.0

- ✓ Recipients may be enrolled part-time as a classified student in a post-high school institution

2 Awards

- ✓ Scholarship established for students pursuing degrees in Finance or Entrepreneurship
- ✓ Recipient may be enrolled half-time or full-time as a classified student in a post-high institution.

14. Charles S. Iwata, Jr. Memorial Annual Scholarship

1 Award

✓ Must be pursuing Hawaiian Studies or Hawaiian language

15. Choy-Kee 'Ohana Scholarship

- ✓ Minimum GPA 3.0
- Submit two letters of recommendation; one from a teacher or counselor and one from a community organization who can comment on your overall character, achievement, and contribution to serve the greater community
- Submit essay addressing what the biggest problem in Hawai'i is and how you would solve it.



16. Class of 2000 Scholarship

(NEW)

This endowed scholarship was created to honor the Kamehameha Schools' Kapālama campus class of 2000 graduates.

- ✓ Must enroll full-time as a classified student in a U.S. accredited post-high schol institution, including trade, vocational and technical schools recognized by KS
- ✓ Half-time enrollment allowed
- √ 3.0 minimum GPA
- ✓ Non-traditional student defined as a single parent, sole provider, homeless, disabled or ward of the court
- Demonstrate financial need by submitting the FAFSA Submission Summary (FSS) from the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
- ❖ Must provide an essay response to the following question: "The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?"
- Must provide one letter of recommendation from a teacher, employer or community organization leader who can comment on your overall character, achievement and contribution to serve the greater community.

They were proud graduates and active alumni of the class of 1954, and parents to four KS Kapālama alumni ('76, '79, '81, '86). Their life journeys epitomized the challenges faced by their generation, and so were grateful for the opportunities and experiences afforded them by a Kamehameha Schools education. Kanoelani and Paul instilled, and role modeled the importance of education, civic and community engagement, hard work, and kuleana. Kanoelani and Paul had strong ties to the Nānākuli and Lualualei region. Kanoelani was a third-generation descendant of the original Nānākuli Homestead lessees, hula dancer, and retired Hawai'i Department of Education education specialist at Nānākuli High School. Paul was a retired Honolulu Fire Department captain at Nānākuli Station 28 – 2nd Watch, deputy sheriff, and volunteer president of the Honolulu Fire Department Federal Credit Union Board of Directors.
