We hope this letter finds you enjoying summer break with your keiki. I again want to take the opportunity to restate how blessed I have been in serving you and your keiki, the students of Kamehameha School. I know 2018-19 will be another successful year in your child's academic and social development journey. I wanted to share a few new things before the school year resumes and remind you of some exciting things in the 2018-19 school year.

Kumu Wai and the new principal will continue with "Pilina 'Ohana Luncheons." They will begin with welcoming you and your keiki for lunch, followed with a brief moment with just the 'ohana. This will be a time to ask questions, tell us your concerns, your excitements and talk story together to better serve you and your keiki. This year's topic will be around a more in depth understanding of E Ola! outcomes and social emotional learning connecting to Hawaiian identity.

There is one change in a teacher's position; Kumu Boshard will now be our second 'ōlelo language kumu, teaming with Kumu Silva. All students will now have 4 language classes within a 6 day cycle. Kumu Boshard's room will be in the old STEAM classroom (621). Kumu Norman will now support all kumu as our 'Ōiwi STEAM coordinator/teacher of the 'Ōiwi STEAM curriculum. Kumu Chang will teach all science classes. We are in the process of hiring a 4th grade kumu.

As always, Kula Ha'aha'a's desire and efforts focus on, creating a school that provides all students the feeling of belonging. Academic success for each student is the goal of every staff member at KS. Maintaining the effort to create opportunities for real life, relevant, active learning opportunities that are student-centered. 
